

Add a Storage Closet To Your Home



This ebook will show you the specific steps to go from a cluttered area in your home to an easy to build and organized closet storage center that you can store your stuff in and hide it all at the same time.

For this task we will be removing approximately 9 feet of upper and lower cabinets, complete with laminate countertop, to make room for the new closet which will have another storage area above the basic closet. Bypass sliding doors will be used to hide all items inside both storage compartments and still allow for easy access.

After the complete removal of cabinets and counter top, the area is simply void of any obstacles and construction can begin.

Here is a list of the major supplies we used to build the closet unit from floor to ceiling, a height of 9 feet and almost 9 feet wide. The interior of the closet will be 26" deep to accommodate hanging clothes and other garments. This unit will also have 1/3 of the width set up with shelves instead of closet rod.

Required material:

6 – 2 x 4 x 10' pine

2 pcs 4 x 8 x 3/8" thick plywood BD
